As pro-lifers, we recognize that we can't change things ourselves, but all things are possible with God. Our prayer vigils and peaceful witness will continue. Whether we succeed or not, at least we tried. Yes, Luisa, reproductive freedom is here. We can choose life or death, good or evil, and we will reap the consequences.
